Each year, **Dr. Paul Kavanagh** brings students together from across Canada, in Ottawa, for a morning presentation before participating in the November 11 Remembrance Day ceremonies.

When the COVID-19 pandemic disrupted events around the world, Operation Remembrance was successfully initiated online through YouTube, maintaining the strong values and educational mission of the original live program.

The online premiere in 2020 featured components from students and schools across Canada. It also featured several veterans speaking about their experiences. The primary focus of the video was to educate students on the importance of honouring Canada's military history. Specific topics were presented by guest speakers that included students, teachers, and veterans.

DAY 1: INTRODUCTION AND "GRANDFATHER DRUM"

Dr. Paul Kavanagh will be introduced and will briefly explain why we inaugurated Operation Remembrance.

We are honoured to have Her Excellency the Right Honourable Mary May Simon, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Canada, share her message for Remembrance Day.

Following the Governor General, we will begin with **GEORGE O'NEILL PUBLIC SCHOOL (ON)** offering a Grandfather Drum ceremony, honouring all veterans.





DAY 2: "PASS THE POPPY"

Introduction from the **Royal Canadian Legion, Dominion Command, President Bruce Julian.** Mr. Julian's speech will be briefly explaining the importance of the poppy and celebrating it's **100th anniversary**.

We will then share the **Pass the Poppy** video. The Pass the Poppy video tribute was initiated by **Mr. Rocco Speranza**: Spiritual Care & Guidance, and Community Involvement, Animator. JOHN F. KENNEDY HIGH SCHOOL (QC). EMSB.

THE PRIME MINISTER OF CANADA, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE JUSTIN TRUDEAU, addresses all Canadians in the Pass the Poppy video.

105TH ANNIVERSARY

DAY 4: KOREAN WAR

Students from ST. PAUL'S CATHOLIC SCHOOL (ON) will honour our veterans of the Korean War, paying respects to the **70th anniversary** to the Battle of Kapyong, 1951.



DAY 5: HONOURING VETERAN JOE SEGAL

12-year-old Aiesha Al-Maziad, a new Canadian of PORT WILLIAMS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL (NS), will introduce Joe Segal, a World War II veteran.

This video will conclude with an original composition by MaryAnn Dufour from KING'S-EDGEHILL SCHOOL (NS), addressing the challenges of military families.

DAY 9: ROYAL CANADIAN NAVY

The fateful history of the HMCS Kootenay will be discussed by students at KITSILANO SECONDARY SCHOOL (BC).

The story of the HMCS Chicoutimi and the SILVER CROSS MOTHER will be honoured by TRAFALGAR SCHOOL FOR GIRLS (QC).
