### **Pembina Trails School Division**

### By-law No. 122

Being a by-law of the Board of Trustees of Pembina Trails School Division for the purpose of borrowing the sum of One Million Two Hundred Three Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$1,203,300) and of issuing a Debenture and/or Promissory Note (hereinafter called the Security) therefore.

WHEREAS it is deemed necessary and expedient to raise by loan the sum of \$1,203,300 on the credit of the said School Division for the purpose of payment for the projects as authorized on Schedule "B" attached.

THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Schools Act, the Board of Trustees of the Pembina Trails School Division duly assembled, enact as follows:

- 1. That it shall be lawful for the said School Trustees to borrow the sum of \$1,203,300 by the issue and sale of the Security of the said School Division as set out below.
- 2. That the said Security shall be issued at Winnipeg, Manitoba and shall be dated the 31st day of December A.D. 2017 and shall be payable to the Minister of Finance, Winnipeg, Manitoba as follows:
  - The Security shall be so issued that the amount thereby borrowed shall be repayable in twenty (20) equalized consecutive annual instalments of \$85,625.92 each, including principal and interest at the rate of 3.625% per annum, payable annually on the 31st day of December as per Schedule "A"
- 3. That the first instalment shall be payable on the 31st day of December A.D. 2018
- 4. That the Security shall be signed by the Secretary-Treasurer and countersigned by one of the Trustee of the said School Division.
- 5. That provisions shall be made for the payment of the said Security and such provision shall form part of, and be included in, the annual statements of monies required for the purpose of the School Division.

#### SUMMER SCHOOL PATROLS

If you attended the recent October regional meetings, you'll remember that one of the presentations was an overview of association risk management services. (If you weren't in attendance, you can find the presentation here.) That presentation made mention of summer school patrols that risk management (under the auspices of MSI insurance) implemented a number of years ago. In summer 2017, a total of 2528 school patrols were conducted in Winnipeg, Brandon, Lorette and Iles des Chenes. There were also 14 neighbourhood watch calls related to suspicious school-ground activity. Construction sites and school roofs proved to be a big draw for after-hour activity, accounting for a large percentage of reports. There was also graffiti and vandalism reported, as well as incidents of after-hours trespassing. Incidents were not restricted to any particular area or areas, although some individual schools attracted more attention than others. These in turn were patrolled more frequently in a proactive effort to stop trouble before it started.
