Most bomb threats are received by phone. Bomb threats are serious until proven otherwise. Act quickly, but remain calm and obtain information with the checklist.

If a bomb threat is received by phone:

- **1.** Remain calm. Keep the caller on the line for as long as possible. DO NOT HANG UP, even if the caller does.
- 2. Listen carefully. Be polite and show interest.
- **3.** Try to keep the caller talking to learn more information.
- **4.** If possible, write a note to a colleague to call the authorities or, as soon as the caller hangs up, immediately notify them yourself.
- 5. If your phone has a display, copy the number and/or letters on the window display.
- 6. Complete the **Bomb Threat Checklist** immediately. Write down as much detail as you can remember. Try to get exact words.
- 7. Immediately upon termination of the call, do not hang up, but from a different phone, contact WFPS immediately with information and await instructions.

If a bomb threat is received by handwritten note:

- Call 911.
- Handle note as minimally as possible.

If a bomb threat is received by email:

- Call 911.
- Do not delete the message.

Signs of a suspicious package:

- □ No return address
- **Excessive postage**
- Stains
- □ Strange odour
- □ Strange sounds
- □ Unexpected delivery

Do not:

- Use two-way radios or cell phones. Radio signals have the potential to detonate a bomb.
- Evacuate the building until the police have arrived and evaluated the threat.
- Activate the fire alarm.
- Touch or move a suspicious package.

- Misspelled words
- Incorrect titles

- Restrictive notes
