

ADMISSION OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

This policy is applicable to the admission of students who are considered international, exchange, students accompanying parents or legal guardians who are not Canadian citizens or permanent residents, non-permanent residents and Canadian citizens or permanent residents whose parents or legal guardians reside outside of Canada. In all cases, the International Student Program must be contacted.

The Division recognizes the educational and cultural value of international students and student exchange programs, and authorizes the admission of international students to the regular educational programs offered in the Division's schools subject to meeting the conditions of admission established for the requested program.

For a student to qualify as an exchange student, the student must satisfy the Division's 'Guidelines for Student Exchange Programs' (JFABB-E-1), meet the requirements of Citizenship and Immigration Canada, and be approved for admission by the Principal of the requested/assigned school and the Director of the International Student Program.

Privately sponsored international students may be enrolled if the student has met the requirements of Citizenship and Immigration Canada, has submitted all necessary applications, been approved for study in the Division by the Director of the International Student Program, and has paid the necessary fees.

Students accompanied by parents/legal guardians residing in the Division who have secured a Work Permit from Citizenship and Immigration Canada that is valid on September 30 of the academic year will be admitted to study in the Division without payment of fee, provided the student(s) is attending classes in the school on September 30th of the school year, and has approval from the Director of the International Student Program. Refunds are subject to JFABB-E-2.

Students accompanied by parents/legal guardians residing in the Division who have secured a Study Permit from Citizenship and Immigration Canada that is valid on September 30 of the academic year for a degree/diploma program at a recognized post secondary institution will be admitted to study in the Division without payment of fees, provided the student(s) is attending classes in the school on September 30th of the school year, and has approval from the Director of the International Student Program. The parent/legal guardian must be in attendance at the institute a minimum of 50% of the time. Refunds are subject to JFABB-E2.

All international students, regardless of the program sought, must identify a Divisionally approved custodian who is a resident in the City of Winnipeg prior to admission. The Director of International Student Program or designate assumes responsibility for the custodianship of the students involved in the Homestay Program.

The continuance of a student in the Division shall be subject to compliance with the Division's Standard of Behaviour.
