Thank you to families who purchased books in person and online. • We held our Kindergarten Information session on February 23rd. We had many families join us in person. We currently have ~39 students registered for the fall. • I Love to Read week provided many fun opportunities for students for students. It is wonderful to see students so engaged in reading. We welcomed so many guests' readers over the course of a couple of weeks. • Festival du Voyageur week was full of event for staff and students. We had a concert and M. Labossière was able to offer a fun and exciting outdoor activity day on Friday. Thank you to PAC for providing a pancake snack to students. They were delicious. As always, students thoroughly enjoyed all the activities, especially the open fire pit, the pancakes, the hot chocolate station and the taffy on the snow. <p>Upcoming:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There will be no school on March 17th, April 7th, and April 14th. • Report cards are scheduled to be available for families to view on April 5th. • We will be recognizing International Day of Pink on April 12th.

LaBossiere and if there is a vote I say 'yes'.

7.0	Fun Lunch Friday's Georgia Couturier	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fundraising: We expect to have raised \$2100 by the end of March through the hot lunch program. • Affordability for this year: We have received some feedback from parents about affordability of the hot lunch offerings. On average, only 135 kids order lunch each week. This leaves more than half the school without lunches. Some of the children who do not receive lunch are quite upset each week. The profit we make on each lunch is quite small and likely not enough to make the lunches much more affordable. To help increase access to the lunch program and make it more of a "treat", we propose reducing the offering from every week, to every other week. • Going forward on affordability: Mme Rochon is looking into how to assess financial needs for assistance with other school fees. Possibly we could use the same process to determine certain families who could have lunch costs covered. • Krista proposed having an option for parents to "gift" a lunch in the MunchaLunch system. This would be very easy to set up within the system, and parents with the means to do so could choose to add a gift lunch. We could then use those funds to pay for lunches for families who apply/qualify for some assistance. This idea should be followed up in for next years hot lunch program.
